The Effects of Divorce on Children: Your Gift / Response to Them

Children who are experiencing divorcing parents need extra support and consideration. The main issues are loss, changes and transitions. When parents keep their interactions respectful and focus on meeting the needs and well-being of their children, the impact of these issues is considerably decreased. When parents' main way of relating to each other is adversarial and angry, children become caught in the middle - feeling a need to choose sides with parents - resulting in excessive fear, anxiety and atypical, aggressive, withdrawn or regressed behaviors. Your opportunity and gift to children is to decode their behavior in order to ease their pain and allow them to feel their loss, grieve and heal, thereby supporting their return to a more balanced way of being and feeling. Yes, you are the Gift everyday and more specifically at these challenging times. Believe it and you will live it!

Understanding and Responding to the Sexual Behavior of Children

This is a training created by Gail Ryan of the Kempe Children's Center. It is designed to promote adult understanding of children's sexual behavior, as well as teach appropriate adult responses in order to intervene earlier in the development of sexually abusive patterns. The training is particularly relevant for professionals who interact directly with children, those who advise parents in regards to their children, and caregivers of children known to be at risk of sexual behavior problems. The information and strategies given are the results of a study by a group including juvenile sexual offender treatment providers, educators, and early childhood specialists, with a stated purpose to prevent the development of juvenile sexual abusers.

When do I need to send in the registration form?

To have the best chance of securing a slot and avoiding late fees, registrations must be received **before** the due date. **Any registrations received after the deadline will require a \$3.00 non-refundable late fee per training.**

How Will I Know Which Trainings I've Been Registered For?
